These projects are designed to help give your child personal insight into important subjects that are relevant to their spiritual understanding. I personally encourage you to tackle at least one.

Children will earn badges and 15 points for every project that is completed. Children who earn 120 points are eligible for our Summer Reward Trip. All the details are coming soon!

All Independent Projects earn 15 TEAM KID POINTS plus a badge for the Team Kid banner. All content must be written by the child. If children print off information and paste it on a poster, it will not count toward the project requirement. The objective is for children to comprehend the content.



TIMELINE PROJECT: Earn a *Tell the Story* Badge!

Children can attend a Timeline Training Day on a Sunday after church. We will offer three Timeline Training Days, complete with lunch for whoever stays.

Children will earn five points just for their attendance. They can attend all three trainings, if they desire. The trainings will be:

- Sunday March 5th
- Sunday, March 19th
- Sunday May 7th

Children will be given a Timeline Fill-in-the-Blank mastery form on Wednesday May 10th during Team Kid, if they elect to complete it. They will receive an additional 10 points for knowing 70 percent of the material. For our 1st-3rd graders, the goal is to master the New Testament Timeline. The goal for 4th -6th graders is to master the entire Bible Timeline. However, some younger children may want to go for the bigger challenge! I have seen first hand just recently how important this overview of God's purposes is in sharing with those who don't know anything about God or His plan. If our children know this, they truly have a firm foundation God can build upon.

EARN A *SENIOR FRIENDS* BADGE

Adopt a senior adult this spring! Children should let Miss Melody know they want to participate, and they will be matched with a senior adult. If children know an adult they would like to work with, they can let Miss Melody know. *If they did this project last year, they must choose a different senior adult for this year.*

During February/March: Schedule a time to spend a couple of hours doing chores at the home of the assigned senior adult. Be sure to take pictures of all activities.

During April: Arrange a time to enjoy a meal with the senior adult. The child should write a summary by hand of what he/she did on chore day, and another summary by hand of what he/she did on eat-out day.

Read the following article: <https://www.aha-now.com/respecting-the-elderly/> Find two Scriptures that teach us to respect the elderly. Write each one in large letters on a piece of construction paper. Use the article as a help to write a 1/2 page to 1 page about why honoring seniors is important and pleasing to God. Place all the summaries, the verses, and any relevant pictures in a display on a poster board or foam board. Be sure to provide a title for the poster.

TRANSFORMING POWER: Earn the *Grow* Badge

Children will read Romans 12: 2 with their parents and discuss its meaning. Children will then **do three firsthand interviews** with Parkway members to learn how Christ has transformed their lives. Interviews will be done in class with invited guests, or children may interview someone from a designated list on their own (See Miss Melody). Children will present their findings on a **poster board and summarize the story of each interviewee with their picture.** The poster should have **Romans 12:2** written out as a focal point. Children will also **include a visual model**, separate from the poster, that illustrates the point of Romans 12:2. This can be done with objects; it can be a creative drawing or a collage, etc. It needs to demonstrate effort and thought.



DISASTER RELIEF (DR) PROJECT Earn the *Project Help* Badge

Children will explore what Southern Baptists, and specifically what TN Baptists are doing to help meet needs when disaster strikes. Children should go to <https://www.namb.net/southern-baptist-disaster-relief/> and read an overview about how Southern Baptists are involved in disaster relief. They also need to select two videos at the bottom of the page to watch and include. At the top, select *Responding to Crisis* and read that, and finally, google *Baptist Press, Responding to Hurricane Ivan*. Read to see how Southern Baptists responded recently to the hurricane damage in Florida.

In April, children will take a field trip to the Tennessee Baptist DR center and take pictures of what they see and learn. Children will present their findings on a poster, which will include:

1. A handwritten summary of the work of Southern Baptists and relevant statistics from their reading (above).
2. A handwritten summation of what they learn on the field trip.
3. A collection of photos from their field trip with captions.

****All summaries are to be handwritten and in the child's own words.***
